At Sumner-Cowley Electric Cooperative, we take pride in celebrating our members and their contributions to the local economy. This month, we shine the spotlight on Wade Kennard of Conway Springs, owner of The Daily Scoop, a charming small business that has quickly become a beloved destination for ice cream lovers and dessert enthusiasts alike.

Wade and his family embarked on their journey with The Daily Scoop in 2022 when they purchased the building that would become their dream shop. After a complete renovation — stripping the building down to the studs and rebuilding it from the ground up — their doors officially opened in June 2023. It was evident that the shop would be a hit, after selling an impressive 72 tubs (3 gallons each) of ice cream in their opening week.

A SCOOP ABOVE THE REST

The Daily Scoop has set itself apart by offering an extensive selection of 24 flavors during peak season, making it the largest ice cream selection in the area. Among the most popular choices are Superman and Mackinac Fudge, both of which have garnered a loyal following. Whether you prefer your ice cream in a cup or cone, as part of an ice cream cake, or in a unique offering like ice cream flights or ice cream nachos, The Daily Scoop has something for every sweet tooth.

Beyond ice cream, The Daily Scoop has expanded its menu to include a variety of home-baked goods, each crafted with care and bursting with flavor. Their muffins, described as gigantic, moist and packed with the juiciest blueberries imaginable, are hands down the best we've ever tasted at SCEC. Their award-winning cheesecakes range from classic flavors to innovative options like caramel apple, jalapeño, and their fan-favorite bacon maple. And let's not forget the pies and cookies, especially the legendary Sasquatch Cookie — a delightful combination of M&Ms, oats, and chocolate chips. Even SCEC District 4 board member Keith Leddy has a favorite: the chocolate fudge brownie with a scoop of ice cream and a drizzle of caramel. (We won't rat him out on how often he stops by for dessert!)

A TRUE FAMILY BUSINESS

What truly makes The Daily Scoop special is the way the Kennard family is woven into every aspect of the business. Wade, his wife Daphne, and his brother-in-law Chris, and many other family members and friends put in the hard work to renovate the building themselves. His parents, Bob and CJ, who previously ran a bait and tackle shop — plus an ice cream parlor in upper Michigan — relocated to Kansas and now handle all of the baking. Their culinary skills are entirely self-taught, but their numerous awards speak for themselves. The next generation is also involved — Wade and Daphne's two daughters, their nephew, and nine local high school students help run the shop, making it a true family and community effort.

A BUSINESS ROOTED IN COMMUNITY

Wade didn't have to build this business alone. When sourcing vendors and ingredients, he found invaluable support from the owners of Hired Man's Grocery just down the road, who shared their industry knowledge to help ensure his success. This spirit of collaboration and community support is at the heart of The Daily Scoop.

Beyond serving ice cream and desserts, The Daily Scoop extends its reach through catering for weddings, school events, and business meetings. Their ever-changing Thursday and Friday lunch specials and high-demand Saturday breakfast (featuring biscuits and gravy) have also become local favorites. The shop even hosts birthday parties, creating a fun and welcoming space for celebrations.

The Kennards' dedication to Conway Springs and the surrounding rural area is evident in everything they do. They've not only built a thriving business, but they've also created a gathering place where people come together to enjoy great food and even better company.
